We wonder if you would care to support an initiative to calm traffic in those lanes around the Village which are frequented by pedestrians, hikers, runners, cyclists, horse-riders and mobility-scooter users. 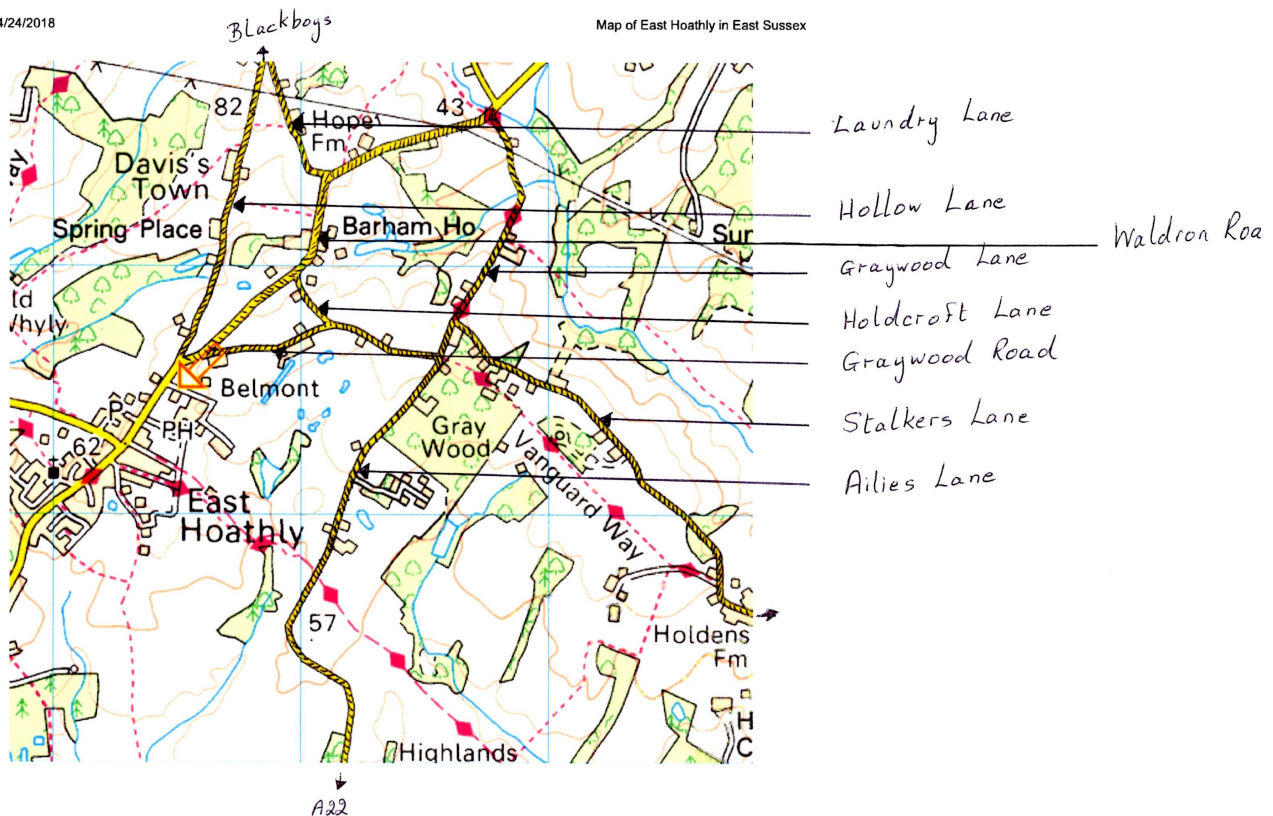
